

DONCASTER CLASSIC CAR & BIKE SHOW 2023

Frequently asked questions about the event

Visitors to the event, not exhibiting or trading

Q - What extras do I need to pay for after paying on entry?

A - Once you have paid on entry, there are no other mandatory payments.

Q – How do I gain entry if I have pre-booked?

A – You MUST either present your ticket (previously sent to you, which you can print off), or show the QR code you could download onto your phone from the ticket.

Q - Does my entry payment cover any members of my family, like children and pensioners?

A - Entry payment is for a single person, although children aged 12 or under will gain free entry. Children over 12 and pensioners pay the same entry fee as adults.

Q - Are there public car parking facilities nearby?

A - There are three car parks available on site clearly marked, free on the day to those visiting the show.

Q - Is the show easily accessible by car?

A – Yes, the show entrance is on Stadium Way, on Lakeside, Doncaster, DN4 5JW, (the venue is well signposted), easily accessible off the M18 motorway (junction 3), Bawtry Road, Doncaster (A638) or White Rose Way (A6182).

Q - What is access like for the public, if not coming by car?

A - The site is within the Lakeside area of Doncaster, within walking distance of the Lakeside Retail Outlet (on a regular bus route), ASDA supermarket and The Dome Leisure Centre. Walkways around the Lakeside provide excellent access with a special pedestrian entrance to the show. Other bus services (No 55, 56, 72 and 73) run from various areas around Doncaster. The nearest bus stops are at the Lakeside Retail Park, Wilmington Drive and Caroline Way off Lake Boulevard.

Q - What facilities are available for the disabled?

A - Disabled parking spaces are available very close to one of the entry points and clearly marked. Most areas of the Showground are level with interspersing tarmac road areas. Suitable toilets are within the main stadium building and all catering facilities are easy to hand on hard-standing.

Q - Will it be possible to temporarily exit the event to access my vehicle in the public car parks and not have to pay again to reenter?

A - We will provide pass-outs in the form of a hand stamp.

Q - Are we allowed to bring pets into the show?

A - We allow access to domestic pets providing they are kept on a lead, always under control and they and their owners don't cause concern or damage to other people or possessions present. It is also the responsibility of pet owners to clean up any mess they create.

Q - Am I allowed to bring my own refreshments into the show?

A - There are no restrictions on bringing food and drink, providing they are for your personal consumption and those accompanying you. Unless a designated trader (who has pre-booked for the event), you are not allowed to sell refreshments to other members of the general public.

Q - Am I able to hold a picnic for myself and other members of my family/friends?

A - Yes, providing you do not intrude on other visitors. We do NOT allow BBQs however.

Q - What refreshments are available at the show?

A - A full complement of items will be available, from tea and coffee to canned drinks, from hot and cold snacks, to more fulfilling meals, plus a fully licensed bar. Hopefully, other traders will also be selling retail chocolates and sweets as well as fresh and bottled/boxed items of food.

Q - Are there any indoor areas to shelter during inclement weather?

A - Limited space is available inside the outer limits of the stadium where the licensed bar and toilets are situated.

Q - Can payment for entry be made in any other way than cash?

A – If you pre-book (at a discounted price), your entry code will be scanned. We also have facilities to pay via credit/debit cards for those who have not pre-booked.

Q - What facilities will be available for children?

A - A variety of children's entertainment including rides will be on site.

Q - What assistance will be available, if required?

A - First-aiders will be on site in case of minor health issues and visitors will be able to have announcements made over the public address system, in case of loss of articles or the need to get in touch with colleagues and families. Marshals wearing high-vis jackets (some of whom will have walkie-talkie communications), will also be able to direct you to other individuals who may help.

If bringing young children along, we recommend you have a photograph on your phone, identifying them and the clothing they will be wearing on the day, to allow our Marshals to assist in finding them, if they get lost. We suggest children are always directed to the PA system control point (clearly marked on the site plan in the programme), as a meeting place.

Q - Can I take photographs and videos during the event?

A - The only restriction to taking any photographic record is where a specific vehicle owner or members of a family, object. You should not be taking photographs of people without their permission.

Q - Are there any restrictions relating to the recent pandemic?

A - The Organisers will follow national Government guidelines at the time.

Q - What time does the event close?

A - The official finish time is 4pm, at which pedestrians are asked to leave the site in readiness for all vehicles to exit the event as soon as possible. The site must be cleared by 5.30pm.

Q – Is there a programme of activities and other information to refer to once at the show?

A – A quality programme will be issued free to all upon entry. This will contain a plan of the site and other information required during your stay.

Q – Where does the profit go that is raised at the event?

A – This money goes into the Rotary Club of Doncaster St George's Charitable Trust fund, for ongoing distribution to other charities and good causes.
